Directions to Prineville and Crook County Fairgrounds:

From Portland - Take Hwy. 26 past Mt. Hood and head south towards Bend. At Madras, Hwy 26 and Hwy 97 will merge. You should continue south through Madras. Just south of Madras you will come to a junction where Hwy 97 will continue south and Hwy 26 will veer off to the left towards Prineville and John Day. Take this exit and head to Prineville. Once in Prineville you will go east through town on Hwy 26. Look for signs to the fairgrounds. At the stoplight, you will make a right turn ... head to the main entrance of the fairgrounds. The entrance is just past an RV Campground. **From the South** - Take Hwy 97 to Bend. You will reach a "Y" where Hwy 97 heads left to Portland or goes right to business 97. Take the Hwy to the left and head to Redmond. At Redmond you will come to a major intersection. Follow signs to Hwy 126 east to Prineville. This will be a gentle right turn. You will come to a stop sign a couple of blocks later.

Take a right to Prineville continuing to follow Hwy 126 east. Once in Prineville you will go east through town. Look for signs to the fairgrounds. At the stoplight, you will make a right turn ... head to the main entrance of the fairgrounds. The entrance is just past an RV Campground.

From Eugene/Salem - Take Hwy 126 to Sisters. From Sisters continue on Hwy 126 to Redmond. At Redmond continue on Hwy 126 following signs to Prineville. Once in Prineville you will go east through town. Look for signs to the fairgrounds. At the stoplight, you will make a right turn ... head to the main entrance of the fairgrounds. The entrance is just past an RV Campground.

From the East/Burns - Take Hwy 20 towards Bend. Approximately 10 miles prior to reaching Bend, there will be a right turn. The sign will read "Powell Butte, Prineville" (and maybe Alfalfa). Take this turn and continue on this road several miles. You will go past the Bend airport. Continue until you reach Hwy 126. There will be a stop sign at this junction. Turn right (east) and follow Hwy 126 to Prineville. Once in Prineville you will go east through town. Look for signs to the fairgrounds. At the stoplight, you will make a right turn ... head to the main entrance of the fairgrounds. The entrance is just past an RV Campground.

HALTER

Suri, Silky, Classic, Light/Medium, Moderate Heavy, Extreme Heavy, and Non-Breeder Classes are open to any llama that has ***not achieved*** an ILR Champion Status.

Argentine llamas must enter in their respective wool divisions. They will then be eligible for the Argentine Champion Class.

Production Pair: Two offspring of either the sire or dam and be judged as the ability of a parent to pass on positive traits to their offspring (Non ILR Point)

Bred & Owned: Consists of one animal, this animal must have been bred, born, and still owned by the original breeder. (Non ILR Point)

LLAMA AGE DIVISIONS:

Juvenile (5 mos. to <12 mos.)

Yearling (12 mos. to <24 mos.)

Mature (Over 24 mos.)

Animal age on day of show will be used to determine appropriate class

WOOL DIVISIONS:

Suri - Fiber exhibits a distinct locked architecture with luster - hangs straight down from the midline on the back - consists of locks that form close to the skin - exhibits independent movement - exhibits a cool, slick handle exhibits no crimp - exhibits loft - coverage may vary from light to medium - Ideally entries exhibit the majority of these criteria.

Silky - Fiber exhibits a very soft or silky handle - may exhibit some wave or crinkle but no crimp - may exhibit some loft - may exhibit luster - guard hair is nearly indiscernible - coverage may vary from light to heavy – Ideally entries exhibit the majority of these criteria.

Classic - Abundant guard hair visible on the body and neck of the animal, with short and minimal "downy" undercoat - the presence of a guard hair "mane" on the back of the neck - a natural change in the fleece at the level of the elbow/stifle, with fleece below this point being very short - natural windows of short fleece, brisket, belly, flank minimal fleece on legs/head with characteristics like guard hair, not the downy undercoat.

Light/Medium Wool - Animals may be double coated with moderate density and short to moderate length - front legs may exhibit coverage extending down the leg with minimal coverage below the knee - rear legs may exhibit coverage extending down the leg with minimal coverage below the hock

Moderate Heavy Wool - Animals will exhibit even neck fleece that blends into body fleece of moderate density and length - front legs will exhibit coverage down to the knees, potentially down to the toes with a decline in coverage below the knees - rear legs will exhibit coverage down to the pastern on the back of the legs with minimal coverage on the front of the legs.

Extreme Heavy Wool - Will exhibit abundant neck and body fleece - front legs will exhibit coverage down to the toes maintaining heavy coverage below the knees - rear legs will exhibit dense coverage down the back of the legs along with fiber on the front side of the legs.

Argentine - Llamas must meet ALA guidelines for Argentine qualification (at least 50% traceable Argentine blood')

SEX DIVISIONS:

Male - classes are for intact males.

Female - classes are for fertile, breed-able females.

Non-breeder - classes for geldings or spayed females.

PERFORMANCE

YOUTH AGES:

- Junior Youth - (7 - 11 yrs.)
- Intermediate Youth (12 - 15 yrs.)
- Senior Youth (16 -18 yrs.)

The age division in which the youth will show will be determined by their age on January 1st 2013, however, if a youth reaches the age of 7 any time during the year, they will be eligible to show as of their birth date. **Intact males 18 months and older are restricted from being shown in the Junior Youth age division classes, due to safety concerns.** The age divisions may be combined if there are fewer than 8 total entries in any two of the age categories.

OBSTACLE: Llamas or Alpacas may be entered in only one of the obstacle divisions (Youth or Open)

Novice - Class is open to any animal that has not received 35 ILR Performance points

Advanced - This class is open to any animal.

Maiden - This class is open to any animal that has never entered a Performance class. *(Non ILR Point)*

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Llamas or Alpacas may be entered in only one of the Public Relations (Youth or Open)

Novice - Class is open to any animal that has not received 35 ILR Performance points

Advanced - This class is open to any animal.

Maiden - This class is open to any animal that has never entered a Performance class. *(Non ILR Point)*

PACK: Llamas or Alpacas may be entered in only one of the Pack divisions. (Youth or Open)

Novice - Class is open to any animal that has not received 35 ILR Performance points

Advanced - This class is open to any animal.

- All packs must have two cinches.
- Animals up to 36 months must wear packs, may use day packs, no weight, panniers filled out. Ideas for non-weighted fill: Styrofoam peanuts, foam rubber, wadded up newspaper, etc.
- Animals over 36 months must wear packs. May use any type pack system, panniers filled out, 30 lbs of weight.

Maiden - This class is open to any animal that has never entered a pack class. Animals must wear a pack filled-out as it would be on the trail, no weight. *(Non ILR point)*

OBSTACLE DRIVING: Driving classes are open to any cart-pulling llama. No riders permitted.

PLEASURE DRIVING: Driving classes are open to any cart-pulling llama. No riders permitted.

NON - ILR POINT CLASSES: Llamas or Alpacas

Maiden Performance Classes - These classes are open to any animal that has never entered a performance class.



NOTE: This show is sanctioned and approved by the ILR Show Division. All rules and guidelines for this show will be in accordance with the ILR Show Division and COLA. Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the judge's discretion. Nursing llama mothers may not be accompanied in the ring with their babies. COLA recommends not showing nursing mothers.

FLEECE

SHORN FLEECE

Fleece should be delivered to the show registration area-at the fairgrounds by 8:00 pm. Friday. Fill out and include with your fleece the ILR Entry Tag Form - Form# Fleece002. You need not be present to enter, but you are responsible for delivery and pick up of your fleece. Fleeces not picked up will become the property of COLA.

Fleece Shall - Be shorn, or scissor cut, not brushed. Be shorn within two years of the date of the show. Be skirted so as to exhibit only the prime fleece from the barrel or prime fleece areas only. Be submitted in clear plastic bags. Be judged by the exhibitors number only. Be disqualified if entered with insect or parasite infestation. Have an appropriate staple length for processing. Minimum staple length of 3 inches undercoat. Maximum staple length of 6 inches for those llamas 13 months and older, at the time of shearing.

Fleece Shall Not - Have guard hairs removed. Be washed after shearing. Have grooming products such as crème rinse or other fiber chemicals applied prior to or after shearing.

Age divisions - at date of shearing.

Juvenile - 5 to <12 months
Yearling - 12 to <24 months
Adult - 24 months and over

Fleece Divisions:

Double Fleece with Crimp - Two discernable layers of fiber. Guard hair is stiff and coarser. Undercoat is soft and shorter than the guard hair. Crimp/crinkle in the undercoat. The fleece has loft.

Single Fleece with Crimp - One discernable fiber type. Little differentiation between guard hair and undercoat. Fleece has crimp/crinkle. The fleece has loft.

Single Fleece without Crimp - One discernable fiber type. No crimp/crinkle. Distinct Locks. The fleece has loft. Lower lock density and fleece weight than Suri.

Suri Fleece - Individual, distinct locks. No crimp/crinkle. Cool, slick hand. High Luster. High lock density and high fleece weight.

The fiber judge will also assess whether the fleece has been entered in the appropriate division, and, if not, will move the fleece to the appropriate division. After reviewing the number of entries, the show management may choose to further divide or combine divisions. Judging will take place Saturday during the day.

Fleece Judging Criteria have been developed with the primary positive characteristics of each fleece type to be evaluated. Criteria will also follow fiber industry standards for desirability to attain the most marketable product. One hundred points are possible.

The judge will identify tie-breaker categories in order, for each division or class, prior to judging.

COAT-ON AND FLEECE-ON

Fiber will be the only aspect of the llama considered. Classes do not have a separate entry Tag. Have your animal number, date of birth, gender, date of previous shearing by date and month, owner ID, and llama ILR# ready for the judge. Handler needs to be present during judging. The discernible presence of crème rinse and/or other chemicals will be counted against the animal. Points will be deducted for staple length longer than 6 inches from blanket areas for llamas age 13 months or older. ***Please listen for announcements that judges are available at designated pens for the evaluation.***

Fleece-On Divisions: Same as Shorn Divisions.

Coat On Classic - Guard hair is the primary feature. Minimal visible undercoat. Undercoat of 2.5 inches or less. Shoulder and blanket fiber of same length and density. Coat may be brushed or shorn.

The fiber judge will also assess whether the fleece has been entered in the appropriate division, and, if not, will move the fleece to the appropriate division. After reviewing the number of entries, the show management may choose to further divide or combine divisions.

FLEECE PRODUCTS

Products should be delivered to the show registration area at the fairgrounds by 8:00 pm. Friday. Fill out and include with your Project the ILR Fleece Products Entry Tag - Form# Fleece009. You need not be present to enter but you are responsible for delivery and pick up of your fleece. Fleeces not picked up will become property of COLA.

Products shall - Be done solely by the exhibitor. Entry should be tag attached, whenever possible, directly to the entry. The Fleece Product shall preferably be submitted in a clear plastic bag. Show Management understands if the product does not easily fit within a bag, due to size or shape. The purpose of the bag is to keep the entry clean, keep the entry tag with the product, and still allow others to see the entry.

- Yarn used in entries may be handspun or commercially spun.
- Rovings used in entries may be hand carded or commercially carded.
- All entries must be at least 50% llama, exclusive of decorations.
- Decorative non-llama trim or accents may be added, but are not to be the primary element used in creating the fleece product.

Novice or Advanced Adult - Exhibitor will need to self-determine whether he/she is a Novice Adult or an Advanced Adult by reviewing their personal show history to identify past awards, work professionally in the craft, or have an interest in testing their skill. If the exhibitor has placed in the top three in the individual craft, they should consider themselves to be an Advanced Adult in that class.

Youth - Youth will only be judged against other youth.

Fleece Products Classes:

- Knitting Item
- Crochet Item
- Machine Knit Item
- Felted Item
- Woven Item
- Locker Hooking Item
- Handspun Yarn*

***Handspun Yarn** - Skein in 2-yard skeins of at least 2 ounces and gently figure 8 tie in 4 location. Do not twist into a tight skein. It may be spun with an electric spinner, spinning wheel, or drop spindle, but may not have been commercially spun.

Show management, with the Judge's agreement, may choose to combine Novice Adult and Advanced Adult with low numbers of entries

AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded for 1st - 5th place in each class.

Grand and Reserve Champion in Halter will be awarded ribbons and special prize.

Best of Show, Argentine Champion, Fleece-on, Shorn Fleece and Projects will be awarded a special prize.

Performance Grand and Reserve Champion will be awarded ribbons--must have entered in all 3 performance classes,

The Top Five Argentine Champion and Reserve will receive special trophies and 1st - \$100, 2nd - \$75, 3rd - \$60, 4th - \$50, 5th - \$40 and 3rd to 5th will receive framed certificates.

Award Premiums will be paid for the following:

Youth Performance classes will pay \$15.00 for 1st, \$10.00 for 2nd, and \$5.00 for 3rd.

Maiden Performance will pay \$50.00 for the overall winner, must enter in all 3 maiden classes.



People's Choice Award. Any llama entered in the COLA Show is eligible to win a special prize as part of "People's Choice Award". COLA will provide ballots for participants and guests to select the "Top 3" llamas. Turn in ballots to the registration desk by 5:30 Saturday, May 16 to be counted.
